

#### **Conflict in Sri Lanka**

Ethnic Tensions: 1956(?)-1983

Civil War: 1983-2009

 Main rebel group: Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE)

Led by Velupillai Prabhakaran

Fighting for separate state known as "Tamil Eelam"

Overtly and officially a secular group



Canada: around 200,000

United Kingdom: around 120,000

United States: under 50,000

 Diaspora leaders accused of fundraising, engaging in sophisticated propaganda campaigns, radicalizing the youth of the community, and political lobbying on behalf of the Tigers.





#### From Post-War to Post-Conflict?

"Whilst we are in a post-war situation- the guns having fallen silent following the military defeat of the LTTE – I do not think we are in a post-conflict one, defined in terms of one in which the roots of conflict are not being sustained and certainly not being reproduced"

### Post-War Sri Lanka

- Civil War comes to end in May
  2009
- 40,000-70,000 Tamil civilians killed
- LTTE defeated
- President Mahinda Rajapaksa's agenda to "create a Sinhala Buddhist hegemonic state."





## [1] Livelihood Issues

Virtually no permanent structures in the resettled areas in the Killinochchi, Mannar, and Mullaitivu Districts





A large number of households are now headed by women – 89,000 war widows

## **Forced Conscription**

- LTTE's "one family, one person" policy 2006
- "We shot them, threw away our guns, and ran." Niroshan's statement hung in the air for a while. He reflected on it, and then smiled.
- Forcibly recruited by the LTTE at age 16
- Hours after being taken to the front lines, he hatched a scheme with another like-minded youth, deciding to flee when the opportunity presented itself. The Tiger leadership, accustomed to having many of these new recruits vanish from their clutches, had installed "watchers" to ensure that they continued fighting. Niroshan and his friend waited until two of these watchers became distracted, and then shot them dead.

## [3] Islamophobia



"If it goes on like this, the Sinhalese 61% is in danger, is it not? The census is 2011 is extremely dangerous. In it, the Muslim population in comparison to the past is rapidly increasing and their average rate of growth already exceeds 75%."



## Is the Diaspora into Development?

- There is of course some diaspora involvement with issues of development post-war, but not enough.
- Why?
- [1] Leadership rivalries between a variety of organizations has precluded joint development ventures in Sri Lanka.
- [2] Debate about whether it is *ethically defensible* to help the people in the country, particularly when providing this help requires, on some level, *working with* the Rajapaksa government and the military presence in the North and East of Sri Lanka.

- Argument that Tamil struggle is being criminalized in Canada, just as in Sri Lanka.
- Not a new conversation in the community, but has increased following the end of the war.
